

## Melvin L. Schottenstein

Melvin L. Schottenstein spent much of his childhood living in the small central Ohio town of Bellefontaine and moved to Columbus in the mid 1950s where he married Lenore Green. Together they raised their children; Holly, Eric, Amy and Julie.

Melvin Schottenstein's community leadership is legendary, spanning arts, education religious organizations and business associations. Creating the opportunity to help others served as the common theme that founded his tireless efforts in leadership.

A 1958 graduate of Ohio State University's Juris Doctorate program, Schottenstein served as chairman of the board of trustees at Columbus College of Art and Design, sat on the Columbus Museum of Art's board of trustees and was a former chairman of the Columbus Symphony Orchestra's annual fund. He was a partner, former chairman and chief executive officer of the Schottenstein, Zox and Dunn law firm. He was also awarded an Honorary Degree of Laws from Franklin University in 1992.

Schottenstein also was executive vice president of M/I Schottenstein Homes and served on its board of directors and executive committee. Additionally, he served on the board of directors and executive committee of the Huntington National Bank.

Awarded the George Meany Award for public service in 1984 Schottenstein was dedicated to the Columbus Community and leadership.
